

Why is recycLA needed?

Global benefits to the environment and Los Angeles

- ✓ Landfills are a thing of the past. The future is recycling.
- ✓ Greenhouse gas and methane emission reductions will improve air quality.
- ✓ Modernized equipment and cleaner fuel truck standards.
- ✓ Improved and enforced safety standards for workers in the 3rd most dangerous industry.
- ✓ New green jobs creation as hundreds of people are being employed to work in the field and build longterm careers.

Increased Recycling to Meet Zero Waste Goals

- Franchisees are required to reduce disposal in landfills by 1 million tons annually by 2025.
- Blue Bin for All All customers will receive a blue bin for recycling as part of their basic service.
- Green Bin organics recycling will be offered to all customers, at a cost equal to Black Bin.
- Partnership with food rescue and reuse organizations required with financial support.



California Mandates

- AB 939 50% recycling by year 2000.
- AB 32 GHG emissions reduction. Statewide reductions in landfill disposal of 2-3 million tons/year by 2020.
- AB 341 75% of solid waste must be reduced, reused, or recycled by 2020. Most businesses and larger MFDs must arrange for recycling.
- AB 1826 Phases in mandatory recycling of commercial organics.
- Mayoral Mandate of 90% by 2025, 95% by 2035.



Meeting Mandates

- City currently recycling over 76%.
- No current system to meet AB 32, 341 or 1826.
- To meet LA City 2025 requirement of 90% recycling, must reduce landfill disposal by 1 million tons annually.
- LA's new Commercial Solid Waste Franchise designed to meet these mandates

Organic Waste

- Second largest source of commercial waste
- Significant source of green house gases
- Separate, labor intensive waste handling





Organics

- City of Los Angeles composts
- Some is mixed with manure
 - Used at City Parks
 - Given away to the public
 - Sold to large volume users



New or Improved Infrastructure to Meet City and State Requirements

- The Contractors for the Franchise have proposed to utilize 27 facilities.
- Of these, 13 facilities will need to be constructed or improved to meet the City certification requirements.
- 11 facilities are currently accepting organics and food waste.
- This program will bring over \$200 million in new infrastructure to the region to meet the needs of the Franchise System and to recycle organic material.
